<sup>1</sup> Department Head duties involve supervision of the academic **Department of Criminal Justice** that includes 4 professors, multiple adjunct professors, and 2 graduate assistants. Department Head also includes supervision of practitioner staff at **North Delta Regional Training Academy**, including the Director, an administrative assistant, and a graduate student. Administrative duties for the academic department include oversight of the departmental budget, hiring of staff and adjunct faculty, course scheduling and assignment. Duties with North Delta Regional Police Academy include coordination of POST certified pre-service training schedule for both the Police Academy and Corrections Academy offerings, budgetary oversight, safety officer responsibilities, and inventory of equipment and firearms.

<sup>2</sup> Note that the **Institute of Law Enforcement** is charged with the responsibility of providing continuous education and training, beyond basic certification and re-certification training, to law enforcement personnel. Its jurisdiction includes Arkansas, Louisiana, and Mississippi.
