




## Full Time Undergraduate Tuition per year


## **Graduation Rates**



## Projected Job Growth through 2020 by ULM Major – Region 8 (NELA)


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#### Additional jobs by quantity and percentage, as well as average salary

#### Compared to a high school diploma





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

### Six States CUT Higher Education funding



Equitable Allocation of Funds




FY13-14: Funding Formula Percentages and \$\$\$ Over (Under)




# **High Factor Program Allocations**

- Board of Regents (BoR) allocation policy places high-factor (HF) programs at disadvantage
- Tuition cannot offset state underfunding of HF programs
- Program mix = BoR Role, Scope and Mission Statement + regional workforce/economic needs


# Operating Budgets: FY08-09, 13-14

- □ \$678,000 mid-year cut in FY 12-13
- □ \$53.9 million (or 75%) of FY13-14 budget is salaries and benefits
- □ \$7.5 million increase in mandated costs from FY08-09 to FY13-14
- □ \$10.2 million of FY 13-14 state funding is from Overcollections Fund




## ULM Budget Data FY 2009-2014

### Use of Restricted Funds to Operate

ULM currently uses restricted funds to offset costs typically supported by the operating fund. Some examples are:

- Faculty and Staff Salaries
- Adjustment of Faculty Salaries to Market Levels
- Supporting Online Courses
- Utilities and Maintenance

In FY 2014:

- 42% (\$1.44 Million) of the total College of Health Sciences personnel costs are funded from restricted accounts
- \$4.62 Million is budgeted from restricted funds to offset the operating fund
