



BRITISH STUDIES PROGRAM

DATES: JULY 9 – AUGUST 9, 2009
(Dates coincide with ULM's Second Summer Session)

The British Studies Program is a residential summer academic session offered annually in London during July and August. While allowing participants ample free time for independent travel, the session offers undergraduate and graduate coursework in a wide range of academic disciplines. Each course provides supervised research in the libraries, museums, and archives of metropolitan London, with field exercises carrying participants to various places of interest, and a structured exchange of ideas with eminent British scholars, artists, business leaders, and government officials.

A full color brochure is available at the Assistant Dean of Students' Office, Student Center, room 150. Credit hours earned through the British Studies Program are awarded by The University of Southern Mississippi, a fully-accredited institution of higher learning, and are transferable to ULM upon request. A \$250 deposit fee must be paid by May 8, 2009 for those attending. Only applications with a \$250 deposit will be processed for study abroad. Payment may be made with Visa, MasterCard, check, money order, American Express.

Side tours to Germany, Italy, Paris, Scotland, Spain, Switzerland, and Vienna, are available for interested students. Spending money for four weeks should range between \$2,000- \$3,000. Total costs should range around \$7,000-\$8,500. The Stafford student loan program will finance this academic program up to \$10,000 for those who qualify.
