Objectives: A laboratory course to accompany Zoology 111. This course provides students with the opportunity to gain hands-on experience in the identification/characterization of the structural features of the human body.

Examinations: Attendance is mandatory. Daily quizzes will be given at the beginning of each lab period. Quizzes will cover important material studied during the previous lab meeting. The 10 highest quiz grades will count towards your laboratory grade. Missed quizzes will be counted as zeros - there are no makeup quizzes.

Practical examinations will consist of ordered stations with displays requiring identification of indicated model structures. (Spelling counts!) Practicals require labor-intensive setup and can not be reassembled if missed.
