Purpose

The purpose of the ULM Juried Art Exhibition is to recognize student achievement in the visual arts and to provide students with the experience in presentation of art works on a professional level.

Eligibility:

The exhibition is open to all students currently enrolled at the University of Louisiana, Monroe. Students may submit up to three original works in any medium completed during college attendance at ULM and not previously displayed in a Bry Art Gallery exhibit.

Presentation Requirements:

All two-dimensional work must be matted, mounted, or framed. Framed pieces must be ready to hang; Three-dimensional pieces must be stable, secure, and ready for presentation. Quality of presentation is a major consideration in the selection process. Each work must have two completed entry forms: one attached to the front of work, one submitted to the Division of Art Office, Stubbs Hall 141.

Deadline for entries:

All Entries must be delivered to Bry Hall 113 by 4:30 pm, Thursday, April 7.

Contact Mr. Cliff Tresner or the Division of Art Office, Stubbs Hall 141 during regular business hours from April 4 through April 7 to make arrangements for delivery of work.

Return of entries:

Works not selected for the show must be picked up by Monday, April 11. All works included in the show will remain in the gallery for the duration of the exhibition and should be picked up on April 29. The Division of Art will not be responsible for entries left after the pick up dates.

Judging:

A juried exhibition is a search for excellence. Originality, creativity, presentation, and craft will be considered during the judging process. Space limitations dictate that only 35 to 50 entries will be selected for display. The ULM art faculty will judge the entries.

Photography Scholarship Award

Ms. Kay Harper-Hayes will select the Photography Scholarship recipient.

Administrator's Choice Awards:

Five works from the exhibit will be chosen for a one-year art-on-loan display in the Offices of the President, the Provost, and the Director of the School of Visual and Performing Arts. Representatives from the respective offices will select these works. Students selected for these awards will receive a certificate of acknowledgement, placement of their work in an area of influence for a period of one year, and a one hundred-dollar honorarium. All works selected must remain on display until May 2006.
