WHAT'S NEW FOR PREP 2018

Math and English Course **ELIGIBILITY** Information

-Registration in MATH and ENGL courses determined by using the information below:

MATH ACT 30+ (SAT 700+) = MATH 1031 (calculus)

MATH ACT 23+ (SAT 570+) = MATH 1013 (pre-calculus)

MATH ACT 19+ (SAT 500-510) = MATH 1011 (Algebra) OR MATH 1009^ (non-Calculus Algebra) alone

MATH ACT 16, 17, or 18 (SAT 470-490) = MATH 1009^ WITH MATH 1000 (2 CR) - COREQUISITES

MATH ACT 15 OR BELOW (SAT 460 OR BELOW) = MUST TAKE DEVELOPMENTAL MATH AT ANOTHER INSTITUTION OR PLACEMENT EXAM

ENGL ACT 18+ (NEW SAT 25+ or OLD SAT 450+) = ENGL 1001 alone

ENGL ACT 15, 16, or 17 (NEW SAT 23-24 or OLDSAT 410-440) = ENGL 1001 WITH 1000 (1 CR) - COREQUISITES

ENGL ACT 14 OR BELOW (NEW SAT 22 or OLD SAT 400 OR BELOW) = MUST TAKE DEVELOPMENTAL

ENGLISH AT ANOTHER INSTITUTION OR PLACEMENT EXAM

Adult learners are automatically eligible to take the math and/or English placement exam.

Information regarding eligibility and registration for placement tests can be found on the ULM website (http://www.ulm.edu/testingcenter/placement.html). Placement tests may be taken at ULM or any school offering ACCUPLACER. If the test is taken at another test site, the test results must be faxed (318-342-3553) or emailed (testing@ulm.edu) to ULM directly from school where the test was taken. Students should contact the test site for registration procedures and fee information.

Once a student attends a recitation course (MATH or ENGL 1000), placement testing is no longer an option.

Math and English CREDIT based on ACT/ SAT Scores

Credit for MATH 1011 = ACT Math score of 26 or higher or SAT (March 16 – present) Math score of 610-690 Credit for MATH 1013 = ACT Math score of 30 or higher (or SAT Math score of 670 +)

Credit for ENGL given only if scores are earned on a single test date:

Credit for **ENGL 1001** = ACT English score of 28 or higher <u>AND</u> an ACT Composite score of 25 or higher on same test date (or SAT Verbal score of 630 or higher plus a combined Reading and Math SAT score of at least 1130)

Credit for ENGL 1001 and ENGL 1002 = A total of 65 or higher for the combined ACT English AND

Composite Scores on same test date (or at <u>least 1430 for the combined</u> SAT Reading <u>AND</u> Math scores)

3) Other important information

- -After registering at PREP, students may <u>NOT</u> change their schedules on their own.
- -If a transfer class that is a pre-requisite for another course is not yet posted, a PREQ override is needed [SFASRPO form]
- -If a student is BFR for Fall BUT IS EITHER enrolled in SUMMER classes OR is a SOPHOMORE classification by hours, a

CAPACITY override is needed for the student to register in an open BFR class [SFASRPO form]

- IF in MATH or ENGL 1000, students MUST take the recitation course in the FTF Fall semester. Students also
 - SHOULD NOT register for more than 16 cr & SHOULD NOT take Science courses (unless necessary)

- <u>RECITATION COURSES are co-requisites</u> (MATH 1000 & 1009; ENGL 1000 & 1001) and if they are dropped, the set must be dropped. A student who withdraws from MATH 1000/1009 loses 5 credit hours; from ENGL 1000/1001 loses 4 credit hours which <u>can affect financial aid and scholarships</u>.

-If a student has a ULM Scholarship, he/she must earn a TOTAL of 30 hours per year (Fall to Fall).

-CHEMISTRY ELIGIBILITY: CHEM 1001 requires eligibility for MATH 1011 (MATH ACT 19+; SAT 460)

CHEM 1007 requires MATH ACT of at least 23

Important Notes:

- 1. All students in the ULM Honors Program should avoid registering for regular courses in which there is an Honors equivalency to avoid duplication.
- 2. ENGL 1010 is required for all students regardless of whether they have credit for ENGL 1002.
- 3. Pre-pharmacy majors (or other majors lacking a language requirement) are advised to NOT take HIST courses to fulfill their humanities requirements, as the foreign language requirement of the ULM Honors Program will satisfy humanities and avoid unnecessary credits.
- 4. There is no honors foreign language; students take a regular foreign language course.
- 5. Education majors must take their required art class, but must use the Honors Option to fulfill the Honors Art requirement.
- 6. <u>Dual enrollment courses may NOT substitute for Honors courses.</u>
- 7. AP credits are accepted for up to 6 hours of credit (with a minimum score of 4).
- 8. No AP or dual enrollment course may fulfill ENGL 1010.
