Portfolio review is a mechanism for art faculty to monitor and assess individual student artistic progress and report on knowledge, commitment, and ability to complete B.F.A. requirements.

Portfolio review at the sophomore, junior, and senior level provides continuous opportunities to develop, build, maintain, and present a quality portfolio of original personal visual samples culminating in a professional portfolio by graduation. Art majors are formally admitted to the B.F.A. program following successful completion of the first Art 3000 course. The completion of three ART 3000 Portfolio classes is a graduation requirement for the B.F.A. Degree.

**• Portfolio preparation seminar via Zoom, 9:30 am Friday, Sept. 23.**

Online classes cannot specify required dates or times so, **you are invited to attend**. Before the seminar, please review the information links under portfolio reviews at the bottom left of the art home page.

**• Your portfolio will be reviewed online by the presentation of a Portfolio Review Digital Document.**

A Word template will be available with instructions.

**• THE ARTIST STATEMENT is required as part of your Portfolio Review Digital Document**

Prior to submission it is suggested that you request and receive feedback on your artist statement from your major advisor or faculty members of your choice.

**• YOU MUST submit the Portfolio Review Digital Document to Moodle as a Word.DOCX before 10 pm, Monday, Nov. 28.****• See candidate list second page.**

It is expected that the Portfolio Review Digital Document will show representative samples of art-related activity **since the last review** whether assigned, unassigned, independent, or freelance.

**Do not include previously reviewed works.**

**QUANTITY OF WORKS:** expect a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8 works from each completed non-concentration studio art class. No more than 15 concentration class samples. Works with multiple parts count as one. No more than 10 out-of-class samples.

**QUALITY OF WORKS:** Focused, well-illuminated photographs that give the best impression of the works.

**PLEASE DO NOT SUBMIT INDIVIDUAL IMAGE FILES. Assemble your images and submit in one document.**

**GRADUATING SENIORS** should provide images that support their final portfolio as would be taken to apply for employment, grad school, seeking representation from galleries or other professional endeavors, **and include a resume.**

If you have any questions, please contact your advisor or any art faculty.

**The ART 3000 grade will be the average of art faculty grade recommendations based on review of the Final Portfolio Review Digital Document.** Each student's compiled faculty rankings will be available to them the week following submission of the Final Portfolio Review Digital Document.

Comments by faculty will be identified by name. Each faculty member will receive a tangible record of comments made by colleagues.

**Plan ahead.** You should periodically photograph and save digital samples from your portfolio in order to have samples whenever needed.

### THREE ASSIGNED WEEKS STARTING OCTOBER 31 FOR STUDENT PORTFOLIO DISPLAY

To provide for one-on-one portfolio interaction of student and art faculty, starting October 31, three separate weeks of the semester are set aside for student portfolio display in a designated area for faculty to review during that student's assigned week.

Arrangements are being made to provide tables for display in Stubbs 144 and Stubbs 127.

Assigned students are expected to have portfolio works displayed by the first day of their assigned week. The Friday prior could be used for take down and install.

In advance of that week it will be each student's responsibility to schedule individual appointments to meet with each art faculty member during their assigned week of display. Meetings should be scheduled during the professor's regular office hours, or Zoom, at a time that is mutually convenient. It is felt that a 15-20 minute time frame will be sufficient per meeting to discuss each faculty member's comments and recommendations.

You are required to submit a digital draft of your portfolio document to Moodle by the first day of your assigned week, for faculty not able to visit campus, and to use as reference during your meetings.

This does not replace the online submission of the Final Portfolio Review Digital Document due on Monday, November 28.

#### **Your work must be removed from display after your last in-person faculty review.**

There will not be enough space for you to display everything, but you need to have your best work that is representative of each class you have taken while at ULM, or since your last review. You should also bring any work in progress that you would like to receive faculty feedback on. Your digital portfolio will be much more complete. If you have any questions, please email Dr. Noble or Mr. Fassett.
