

### **COMING SOON: CONSTRUCTION PRACTICES LABORATORY BUILDING**





Phase I of the Construction Practices Laboratory Building will go out for bids in June!

This first phase will give SoCM students a weatherproof place—a 4,000 square foot place—to utilize hands-on construction techniques to complete their projects.

When Phase II is complete, the building will be used for multiple courses such as surveying, soils and materials, concrete, and more. Our students will have the benefit of practical, hands-on experience that will put them even further ahead of their competition than they are now.

The total cost of both phases is estimated at \$1.8 million, with Phase I costing \$600,000, which is already committed. Phase II fundraising is now open, with various sponsorship levels available.
