| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Michaelides reported that the revised charge of the committee had been approved by the VPAA and was incorporated into the data sheet. The following statement was added: "The GEC Chair represents the committee on the UCC as an ex-officio member; proposed curricular changes affecting the core must be approved by the GEC, which reviews them concurrently with the UCC." 2. Thompson updated the committee on assessment of the Quantitative Literacy learning domain. Assessment pieces from all disciplines included in this domain will be submitted in February; data will be available for the committee's review at the end of the spring 2021 semester. 3. Following discussion, the committee agreed to establish two baseline measures of success for assessment in all areas: a minimal level of 75% at least partially meets expectations, and an aspirational level of 90% at least partially meets expectations. | | |
