Textbooks and/or Access codes for online courses can be found on each Moodle course page. Students must log in to their Moodle account as quickly as possible once registered to ensure they have the correct textbook and/or access code.

It is the student's responsibility to have textbooks and/or access codes as soon as possible after registration even if they are paid for by the school or district.

Students admitted to ULM for the Dual Enrollment Program may take only those courses on their high school's SACSCOC course list. SACSCOC course lists are sent to each high school's DE Contact individually.

AHSC 2000. MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY. 3 cr. Origin of words and principles of their construction. Definitions of medical terms, diseases, syndromes, and application of terms in clinical practice are stressed. Overview of anatomy and physiology and application to each system is reviewed. LCCN: CHLT 1103

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have a MATH ACT sub score of 19+ (or equivalent).

ART 1009. ART APPRECIATION. 3 cr. A general orientation and understanding of visual and plastic art forms. For non-art majors.

LCCN: CART 1023. **Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.**

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

Electronic access code may be required.

BIOL 1001- The Living World - 3 cr. Basic scientific and biological principles with an emphasis on the structure and processes of organisms. The course also includes a survey of the major types of living organisms. Non-majors only.

No LCCN. Not on the Master Articulation Matrix.

Offered through DE in Fall semesters.

Students must have a MATH ACT sub score of 19 or higher.

Connect Access Code required.

CHEM 1001 - Introductory Chemistry I - 3 cr. HOME SCHOOL STUDENTS cannot take online CHEM. The fundamentals of inorganic chemistry. Prerequisite: Grade of "C" or better in MATH 1009, or eligibility for MATH 1011 or a more advanced mathematics course. Three hours lecture. For non-majors. LCCN: CCEM 1103.

REQUIRES certified Chemistry teacher at the high school to serve as Facilitator.

Offered through DE in Fall semesters.

Students must have a MATH ACT sub score of 19 or higher.

Connect Access Code required.

COMM 2001. PUBLIC SPEAKING. 3 cr. The process of public communication, including an understanding of audience, to produce, evaluate, and critique public expression in public arenas. LCCN: CCOM 2013

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

****In addition to Connect access code (with e-book), students are REQUIRED to use a webcam and headset with a microphone in this course. A program called Collaborate is used to have real-time speeches.**

****Each student must have a Connect access code linked through the Moodle course page**

ENGL 1001. COMPOSITION I. 3 cr. Composition of analytical, expository, and argumentative writing; emphasizing writing as a process that includes analyzing a writing situation, prewriting, drafting, revising, and some documentation.

LCCN: CENL 1013

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18 or higher OR an Accuplacer NG Writing score of 250+ OR a grade of “C” or better in a prerequisite, remedial ENGL **AND must have completed high school ENGL III.**

HIST 1011. WORLD CIVILIZATION I. 3 cr. Survey of world history to the seventeenth century. LCCN: CHIS 1113

Offered through DE in Fall semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

Open Education Resource/Affordable Education Resource (OER/AER) text available within the Moodle course page.

MATH 1011. COLLEGE ALGEBRA. 3 cr. HOME SCHOOL STUDENTS cannot take online MATH. In-depth treatment of solving equations and inequalities; function properties and graphs; inverse functions; linear, quadratic, polynomial, rational, exponential and logarithmic functions with applications; systems of equations.

LCCN: CMAT 1213. **REQUIRES certified Mathematics teacher at the high school to serve as Facilitator.**

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have a MATH ACT sub score of 19 or higher OR an Accuplacer NG QRAS score of 250+ OR a grade of “C” or better in a prerequisite, remedial MATH **AND must have completed high school Algebra II.**

Each student must have a MyMathLab access code

MATH 1016. ELEMENTARY STATISTICS. 3 cr. HOME SCHOOL STUDENTS cannot take online MATH. Descriptive statistics; probability calculations; discrete and continuous probability distributions (including the binomial and Poisson distributions, the normal and Student-t distributions); interval estimations, hypothesis testing, linear regression and correlation. Not applicable to a major or minor in computer science. LCCN: CMAT 1303. **REQUIRES certified Mathematics teacher at the high school to serve as Facilitator.**

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have a grade of “C” or better in MATH 1011, MATH 1013 or MATH 1014 OR College Credit in MATH 1011 (CLEP score of 50+ in College Algebra & ACT MATH subscore of 19 or higher; OR ACT MATH subscore of 26+).

Each student must have a MyStatCrunch access code.

MUSC 1091. ENJOYMENT OF MUSIC. 3 cr. A non-technical course designed to provide the layman with the understanding necessary for the enjoyment of music of various types, including music of different races and ethnic groups. LCCN: CMUS 1013

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

A ULM-specific textbook *may be required* for this course.

PSYC 2001. INTRODUCTION TO PSYCHOLOGY. 3 cr. Principles of psychology as a science, characteristics of human behavior and cognitions and a survey of major topic areas including motivation, learning, emotions, and social and biological factors. LCCN: CPSY 2013.

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

SOCL 1001. INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY. 3 cr. A survey of the basic concepts of sociology and techniques of sociological research; factors and principles influencing the social life of man. LCCN: CSOC 2013

Offered through DE in Fall and Spring semesters.

Students must have an ENGL ACT sub score of 18+ (or equivalent).

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
