Competition presentations submitted for the Louisiana Educators Rising State conference, both live and pre-recorded, may be included for public use by Educators Rising Louisiana.

Competition registration will close on *January 19th*. A limited number of entries for each category will be selected for the competition. Notification of acceptance will be announced by *January 26th*. Any competition with pre-recorded video content or pre-submitted documentation will require these items by February 9th or competition registration will be voided. Students can only participate in one Session A competition and one Session B competition. All competitors must be active-level members of the Educators Rising national organization.
