Source of Aid	Award Amounts	Description	How to Apply
Pell Grant (Financial Aid Office)	\$299-\$2907/semester	A grant awarded to undergraduate students seeking their first bachelor's degree. The grant does not have to be paid back. The federal government determines the maximum award amounts based on your FAFSA results.	Complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .
Louisiana Go Grant (Financial Aid Office)	\$300-\$1000/semester based on enrolled hours  Limited Funds Available	A grant awarded to undergrads who have remaining financial need after deducting Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) and all federal/state/institutional grant or scholarship aid ("gift aid") from student's Cost of Attendance (COA). Must be enrolled in an eligible Louisiana institution on at least a half-time basis (minimum 6 hours at semester school).	Complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .  You must be Pell eligible to receive the award.
Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (Financial Aid Office)	\$375/semester  Limited Funds Available	The Federal SEOG is for undergraduate students with exceptional financial need.	Complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .
Subsidized Loans (Financial Aid Office)	\$1750-\$2750/semester depending on grade classification	Loan program in which the interest on the loan is paid for you while you are in school. Repayment begins 6 months after graduation, date of last class attendance, or when you are enrolled in less than 6 hours.	Complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .  Complete Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note at <a href="http://www.studentloans.gov">www.studentloans.gov</a> .
Unsubsidized Loans (Financial Aid Office)	\$1000-\$3000/semester depending on grade classification	Loan program for those who do not qualify for Federal Subsidized Loans. The interest will not be paid for you. Repayment is that same as the Subsidized Loans.	Complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .  Complete Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note at <a href="http://www.studentloans.gov">www.studentloans.gov</a> .
Parent PLUS Loans (Financial Aid Office)	Varies	Loan is available to creditworthy parents and step-parents of dependent undergraduate students.	Students complete your FAFSA at <a href="http://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> .  Parents apply for the loan at <a href="http://www.studentloans.gov">www.studentloans.gov</a> .
Alternative Loans (Financial Aid Office)	Varies	Loan is available to creditworthy students who have exhausted federal funds or have room in their Cost of Attendance budget.	Students choose the lender and follow the lender's process.

Institutional Merit Scholarships (Scholarship Office)	Varies	These are awarded based on GPA and ACT scores.	Complete an application for admissions.
Talent Grants (VAPA or Spirit Group)	Varies	Talent Grants are awarded by auditioning within the department for which you are applying	Speak directly to the talent or spirit group representative.
Out-of-State Fee Waiver (Scholarship Office)	\$9,100/year	Domestic Non-resident students with a minimum ACT composite of 21/SAT 1060 and a 2.5 cumulative High School GPA qualify for this credit. Students must not require remedial courses (minimum ACT English 18/450 SAT Verbal AND ACT Math 19/460 SAT Quantitative).	Complete an application for admissions.
Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)	Varies	Assistance is based on household size, income, and employment status. Program approval varies.	Contact your local Business & Career Solutions Center. Locations of the centers and more information about the program is listed at: <a href="http://www.laworks.net">www.laworks.net</a>
Louisiana Rehabilitation Services	Varies, but may pay all tuition, fees, books, and transportation	Assistance provided on basis of approved disability by LRS.	Contact LRS at 1-800-737-2966.
ROTC	Full tuition, fees, books, room and board	4, 3, and 2-year Army ROTC Scholarships are available. Must be a U.S. citizen, score a minimum of 19 on the ACT or 850 on the SAT, pass a medical/physical exam, and be able to graduate prior to your 25th birthday. Applicants for the 3 or 2-year scholarship must have a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale to apply.	Contact ROTC at 318-342-1561
