The TEACH Delta Region Project is designed for those who want to pursue a career in teaching, whether this is a career change or their first career.

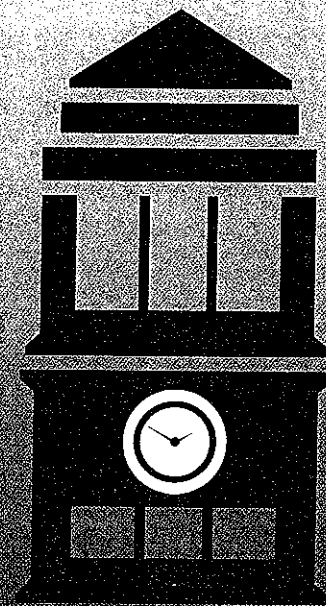
This fast-track program is for individuals that hold any type of bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited university and meet the program admission criteria.

In as little as 14 months, candidates can earn their Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) degree. All coursework is available online.

**Certification areas include:**

- Elementary Education (grades 1-5)
- Secondary Education (grades 6-12)  
\*Areas include: English, Math, Biology, Chemistry, General Science, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Family & Consumer Sciences, and Speech
- Multiple Level (K-12)  
\*Areas include: Art, Spanish, French, Instrumental Music, Vocal Music, and Instrumental & Vocal Music
- Special Education (Mild/Moderate Disabilities)

\*Must have an undergraduate degree in the content area OR 30 hours of coursework in the area. Courses must be 100 level or above with a grade of C or better.

## TEACH Delta Region Fast-track 14 month time line:

Beginning the first summer session, you and your cohort of peers will start with a Summer Institute.

*-The Summer Institute provides hands-on teaching experience by allowing you to work with students while under continual supervision and training of master teachers.*

*In the second summer session you will take 9 hours towards your degree.*

By the start of the academic year, you can begin your first year as a teacher in a school in Louisiana and receive a first-year teacher's salary.

*-During this time you will have an online class as well as scheduled classroom supervision and mentor support.*

In the spring you will continue your teaching career and take an online class with ongoing scheduled classroom supervision and mentor support.

*-During the following summer you can complete your online classes and graduate with your M.A.T. degree.*

## TEACH Delta Region Admission Requirements:

1. Bachelor's Degree with 2.5 GPA (cumulative GPA actual or adjusted)
2. 20 hours of classroom observations in your area of interest along with a written narrative
3. Complete ONE of the following: (Available to take at the ULM Testing Center if needed)  
-ACT score 22 or better - SAT combined verbal & math score 1030 or better OR  
-Praxis I\*\* scores: reading 174, writing 173, math 172 or better \*\*If any part of the Praxis I has been taken (whether or not a passing score was achieved) the ACT/SAT option is forfeited
4. GRE-combined verbal plus quantitative score of 750 is required. (Available to take at the ULM Testing Center if needed)

5. Praxis II-required score varies based on the test taken. To register visit [www.ets.org/praxis](http://www.ets.org/praxis) (Not required to take Praxis I prior to Praxis II)
6. Complete application for admission to ULM Graduate School-located in the Administrative Building 1-142
7. Complete application for TEACH Delta Region-

8. Complete an interview or provide Intent to Hire letter from the employing school district.
