PHARMILY SPOTLIGHT: SAMMY REDDEN, PHARM.D.

For Sammy Redden, Pharm.D., pharmacy has never been just a job. It has been a career defined by curiosity, adaptability, and a willingness to embrace change. From his early days as a pharmacy technician to his current role at Walmart Pharmacy in Kilgore, TX, Redden has built a career by choosing what he calls the most “interesting” opportunities and finding ways to make them work.

A native of Columbia, LA, Redden graduated from the ULM College of Pharmacy in May 2012 and today resides in Longview, TX, with his wife, Kourtney, and their two children, Gloriana, age 12, and Casey, age 9.

Redden’s journey into pharmacy began long before college. Growing up with three older sisters and a mother who worked as a nurse, healthcare was always part of the conversation.

“My mother encouraged us to consider medical careers,” he said. “In high school, I worked as a pharmacy technician and realized this profession fit my personality. It offered the opportunity to help people, provide for my family, and have the flexibility to live wherever I wanted.” That early experience sparked a passion that has carried him through nearly two decades in the profession.

Since graduating from ULM, Redden has gained experience across a variety of pharmacy settings. His career has included positions with Walmart Pharmacy throughout Louisiana and Texas, hospital pharmacy at Byrd Regional Hospital in Leesville, LA, independent pharmacy with Causey’s Pharmacy in Natchitoches, LA, and Medical Plaza Pharmacy in Longview, TX.

Today, he serves as a pharmacist with Walmart Pharmacy in Kilgore, TX, a role he has held since 2022.

Looking back, Redden sees a common thread throughout every career move he has made. “As I look back on my career thus far, I realize that I never chased awards, achievements, or money,” he reflected. “I always chose interesting. About every three or four years, I would get a little antsy in my current role and look to do something different. Sometimes for the better, sometimes for the worse, but always interesting.”

As pharmacy continues to evolve, Redden remains energized by the profession’s growing clinical focus.

“I’m passionate about embracing change and finding new ways to continue providing quality medical care to our customers,” he said. “Pharmacy is becoming less transactional and more clinically based. With that comes unique challenges and resistance to change.” He prides himself on helping implement new ideas and services, especially when others see obstacles. “Simply put, when no one else can make it work, I’ll figure it out.”

That mindset also shapes his vision for the future. As he enters the second half of his career, Redden hopes to play a role in advancing pharmacy practice and expanding opportunities for pharmacists to provide patient care. "I've always hated when someone tells me something cannot be done," he said. "As a profession, we can do anything. The right question is, 'What would it take?'"

Redden's path to ULM came with a bit of humor and a life-changing scholarship. Originally accepted and enrolled at Wingate University in North Carolina, where he attended high school, Redden was reminded by his mother late in his senior year that ULM had a College of Pharmacy.

"I told her I would only apply if the application fee was less than \$30," he recalled. "That application fee was \$25." When his acceptance letter arrived, it included a full-ride scholarship offer. So when my parents asked me what it said, I simply replied, 'It says I'm going to ULM!'"

For Redden, some of his most treasured memories from ULM involve the friendships he built and the experiences he shared with fellow students. "I created some unforgettable memories with people I still call my best friends today," he said. "Harris Hall forever." Living on campus throughout his college years allowed him to immerse himself in university life. He attended sporting events, looked forward to baseball game giveaways, took advantage of the famous \$1 lunches, and enjoyed traditions such as Casino Night and Spring Fever Week, recalling that the Ludacris concert was a lot of fun.

Other favorite memories include BCM mission trips, late-night road trips for beignets, impromptu crawfish boils, and countless conversations that stretched late into the night. One particularly memorable dorm-room upgrade involved convincing a hall director to allow him to remove an extra bed and replace it with a foosball table. "It led to some epic foosball games," he said. He also had a lot of fun starring in a semi-viral rap video ([Do the Lung Flute!](#)) for a Pharmacy Accessories class project. While Redden admits he struggled with self-doubt during pharmacy school, several faculty members helped shape his confidence and professional development. One moment in particular has stayed with him throughout his career. "Dr. Mandy Ranzino Storer once told me during a clinical rotation, 'You do know you're better at this than you realize?'" he said. "I wasn't the best student and dealt with a ton of self-doubt during pharmacy school. She has no idea how much confidence that simple question gave me." He also credits Dr. Jessica Brady for being a constant source of encouragement and support.

When asked what advice he'd give to anyone interested in pharmacy, he said he would encourage them to challenge stereotypes and keep an open mind. "Don't make assumptions about what a pharmacist looks like," he said. "I always thought pharmacists were the quiet, methodical, 'hide behind the screen' type. What I love about pharmacy is that there is a place for everyone." Known for his larger-than-life personality, Redden found that pharmacy offered opportunities to succeed in a wide variety of roles and settings. "It was much easier than I expected to fit into any role I took on throughout my career."

Outside of work, Redden enjoys watching WWE wrestling, following sports, and volunteering extensively through his church.

As part of the College of Pharmacy's Dream Big! initiative, Redden shared a professional aspiration rooted in advancing patient care and expanding pharmacists' clinical impact. He hopes to help shape a future where pharmacists play an even greater role in healthcare delivery. And on a more personal note? "I would like to learn how to drive a stick shift."

Whether championing the future of pharmacy, serving patients, or reminiscing about late-night adventures with lifelong friends, Redden approaches life with the same philosophy that has guided his career: stay curious, embrace change, and never stop asking what's possible.

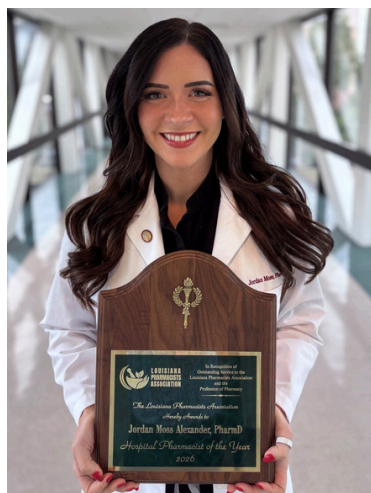

CVS SECURING THE FUTURE OF PHARMACY IN LOUISIANA SCHOLARSHIP

The University of Louisiana Monroe College of Pharmacy has announced a new scholarship program funded by CVS that will provide significant financial support to Pharm.D. students over the next five academic years.

Beginning in Fall 2026 and continuing through Spring 2031, the program will provide up to \$600,000 annually in scholarship funding, with awards distributed through the ULM Foundation. Scholarship recipients were selected based on demonstrated financial need and completion of the ULM Foundation scholarship application process.

The scholarship was awarded to 52 students for the 2026-27 academic year.

To be eligible, students must be enrolled full-time in the ULM College of Pharmacy Doctor of Pharmacy program, meet residency and citizenship requirements, maintain good academic standing, and demonstrate financial and personal need through the FAFSA process. Importantly, students who receive the scholarship are not required to work for CVS after graduation and have no service commitment or repayment obligation associated with the award.

Recipients will participate in a College of Pharmacy recruitment activity during their award year, submit a reflection on how the scholarship impacted their academic and professional growth, and serve as a College of Pharmacy Alumni Ambassador for one year following graduation.

The scholarship program reflects CVS's commitment to investing in the future of pharmacy education and helping make a pharmacy degree more accessible for students across Louisiana. ULM College of Pharmacy leaders expressed gratitude for the partnership and the opportunities it will create for current and future pharmacy students.

Dr. George Matthaïolampakis has been appointed as the next Director of the School of Basic Pharmaceutical & Toxicological Sciences (BPTS), effective August 31, 2026.

The committee recognized Dr. Matthaïolampakis' deep understanding of the College's mission, culture, and strategic priorities. His experience within our institution, combined with his dedication to fostering research excellence, interdisciplinary collaboration, faculty development, and student engagement, positions him well to lead the School into its next chapter.
