Student Learning Outcome #1:

(1) The student will demonstrate advanced knowledge of (a) the basic human communication and swallowing processes; (b) the nature of speech, language, hearing, and communication disorders and differences and swallowing disorders; (c) the principles and methods of prevention, assessment, and intervention for people with language, speech, and swallowing disorders; and (d) professional issues including, but not limited to tenets of the Code of Ethics, licensure and credentialing requirements, and scope of practice.

Measure(s):

Upon completion of 30 hours of academic course work (excluding 5076 clinic credits), graduate students will take the PRAXIS exam.

Target(s):

On the first or second administration of the Praxis exam, 80% of the graduate students will pass with a score of 162 or better prior to completion of the Clinical Fellowship Experience.

Results - Explain target met answer:

Upon completion of 30 hours of academic coursework (excluding SPLP 5076), 80% of the graduate students passed the PRAXIS examination with a score of 162 or better prior to completion of the Clinical Fellowship year.

Actions to Seek Improvement or Maintain Success:

Based on recommendations from the Council on Academic Accreditation (CAA), the PRAXIS scores will not be used in the future for Student Learning Outcomes.

Student Learning Outcome #2:

(2) Students and alumni will demonstrate knowledge of the principles and methods of prevention, assessment, and intervention for people with communication and swallowing disorders, including consideration of anatomical/physiological, developmental, and linguistic and cultural correlates of the disorders to evaluate, treat, and interact with clients.

Measure(s):

(2a) Students will complete two eight week long internship experiences in the public schools and/or the medical setting.(2b) Graduates/Alumni will complete a Graduate/Alumni Survey indicating whether or not the academic program provided them with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform as a professional Speech-Language Pathologist.(2c) Internship Supervisors will complete a Supervisor Survey of the knowledge and skills appropriate for the work setting (e.g., hospitals, schools).

Target(s):

2a) During the internship experience, 80% of the students will receive a score of 3.75/4.0 or higher, in all areas, on a scale of clinical proficiency as completed by their externship supervisors. Areas evaluated include: client management, assessment, treatment, report writing, professionalism, and interpersonal interactions. (2b) Six months to one year following completion of the M.S. program in Speech-Language Pathology, 80% of the graduates/alumni who respond will indicate agree or strongly agree on the Graduate/Alumni Survey that the academic program provided them with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform as a professional Speech-Language Pathologist. (2c) Following graduation, 80% of the supervisors/employers who respond will rate the interns as possessing good to excellent knowledge and skills appropriate for the work setting on the departmental Supervisor/Employer Survey.

2a: During the internship experience, 90% of the students did receive a score of 3.75/4.0 or higher in all areas, on a scale of clinical proficiency as completed by their externship supervisors. Areas evaluated include: client management, assessment, treatment, report writing, professionalism, and interpersonal interactions.

2b:Six months to one year following completion of the M.S. program in Speech-Language Pathology, 80% of the graduates/alumni who

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responded indicated that they agree or strongly agree on the Graduate/Alumni Survey that the academic program provided them with the knowledge and skills necessary to perform as a professional Speech-Language Pathologist. 2c: The departmental Supervisor/Employer Survey data was unavailable.

Actions to Seek Improvement or Maintain Success:

The Supervisor/Employer Survey should be developed to be completed on-line in the future to ensure consistency of collection of results.

Student Learning Outcome #3:

3a) By the final semester in graduate school, 100% of the graduate students in speech-language pathology will use adequate oral communication skills as reported by their supervisor.(3b) After completing all academic course work and clinical practica, 100% of the graduate students will demonstrate adequate written language skills as demonstrated by a grade of B or higher during their final semester in clinic (SPLP5076).
