What's New with the COMM Program?

Change is good, right? At a minimum, it's certainly inevitable. The COMM Program at ULM has undergone considerable positive change over the last 4 years or so. The exciting changes include:

- Awarded a \$750,000 Louisiana Entertainment Development Fund grant to create a new Film & Media Arts concentration, begin a summer film camp for area high school students, and build a film studio operation to provide opportunities for our students to work on professional film sets. The State of Louisiana hopes through this grant that ULM will help attract more filmmaking to the NELA region with our new Warhawk Innovation Studios, and set the stage for industry growth statewide.
- Retirement of the Public Relations concentration (PR classes subsumed into the Integrated Media concentration) and renaming of the Advocacy concentration to Communication Studies. Reworked undergraduate curriculum to create more opportunities for majors to "customize" their academic experience.
- Graduate degree program renamed MA in Strategic Communication and revamped to include more strat comm classes. It is also now offered exclusively online so as to be more widely available to working professionals. In the short time since these changes were implemented, the number of program participants has doubled and students are raving about the academic experiences they are receiving.
